## What Is Snapchat?

Snapchat is a photo-sharing app where users can send photos or videos to their friends. These will display on screen for up to ten seconds before being deleted, although it is possible to screenshot messages and use other apps to capture the content. Snapchat could be used for messages of a sexual nature or also mean messages. Learn how to set privacy settings with the "how-to" quide.

Basic Snapchat settings to manage who can see information:

<u>Choose who can see your story:</u>

Step 1 — Go to your profile and tap the gear icon in the top right corner.

Step 2 – Scroll down to Privacy Control and tap View My Story. Select who can view your story. With a Custom list, you can block individual contacts.

### Location sharing:

**Step 1** – From your **home page**, select the **location pin** in the bottom left corner.

**Step 2** – Tap the **gear icon** in the top right corner.

Select **Ghost Mode** to completely hide your location. Alternatively, you can choose to hide your location from specific people.

Also, toggle on **Hide my live location** to turn off live location
updates. If toggled off, your location
updates in real time, even if the app is
closed.

## Parent and carers support

### Snapchat - Top Tip!



Snapchat Family Centre is an in-app tool that lets parents and carers stay on top of who their teens are in contact with on the app. Learn more <u>here</u>.

To set up Snapchat Family Centre:

Step 1 — Create or login to your personal Snapchat account. From your profile, tap Add Friends and add your child by searching their username. Return to your profile.

Step 2 – Tap the gear icon in the top right corner to get into Settings. Under Privacy Control, tap Family Centre and select your child's name > Send invitation.

Step 3 – Login to your child's account (or ask them to access it on their phone). From their profile, tap Add Friends and then your username.

Step 4 – Tap View Invitation and then Accept.
On your own account, you can now tap your child's profile in Family Centre to see their activity, which you can use to start conversations around their online experiences.

### Did you know?

The minimum age for Snapchat is 13.

#### Customise who can contact you:

If your child is under 18, you can change this setting so that only friends can contact them.

To change this privacy setting:

Step 1 — Go to your profile and tap the gear icon in the top-right corner.

Step 2 – Scroll down to Privacy Control and tap Contact Me. Tap either Friends or Friends and Contacts.



### To report, block or remove someone on Snapchat:

**Step 1** — go to their **profile**. You can do this by going to your **chats list** and tapping their **profile image**.

Step 2 – Tap the 3 horizontal dots in the top right corner. Select Manage Friendship.

Step 3 - Tap Report to report them. Select the reason and tap Submit.

Tap Block to block them and Remove Friend to remove them.
